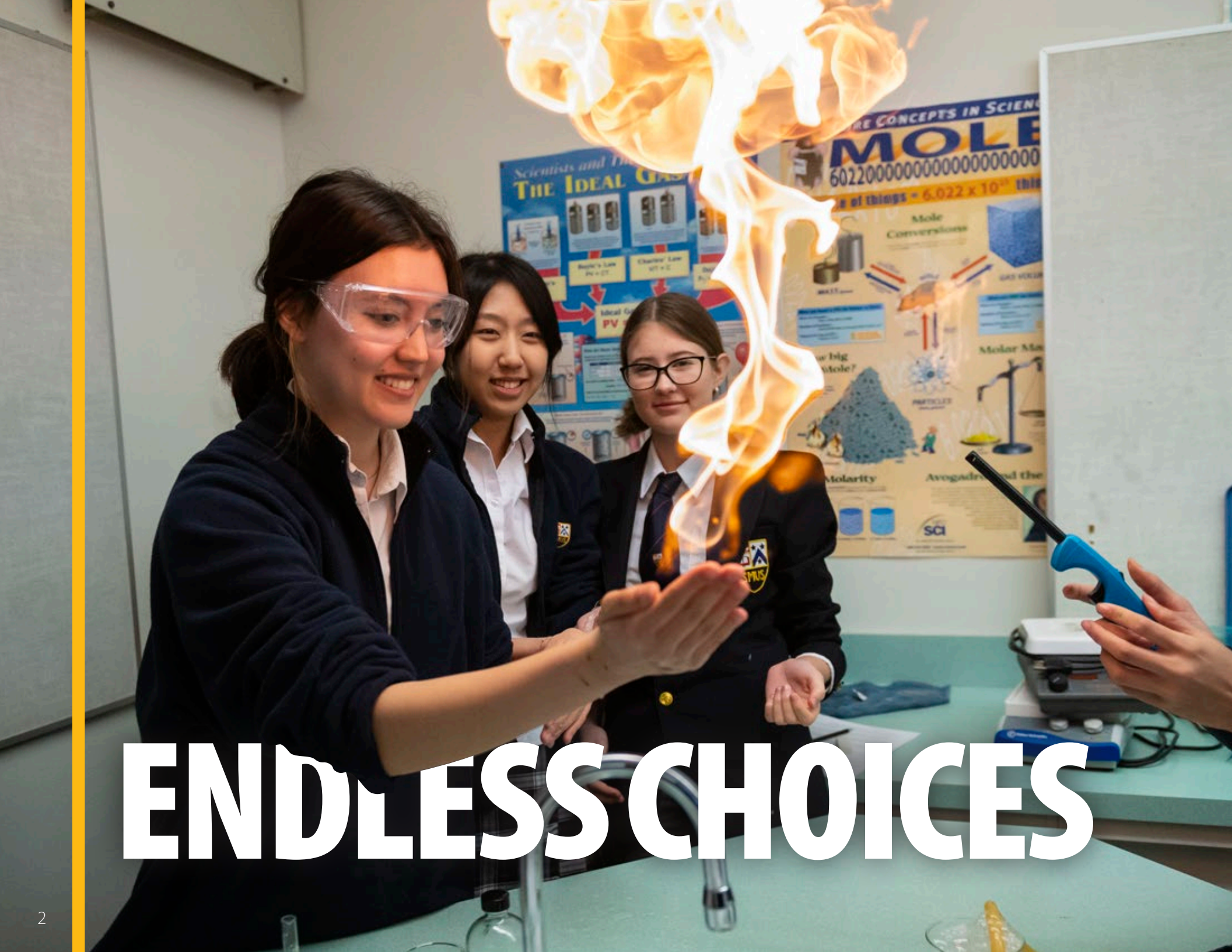

Joining St. Michaels University School means you get the best education to help prepare you for life, thanks to the abundance of choices you are given to make your education your own. We offer general and specialized courses in English, social studies, sciences, engineering, robotics and design, math, French and modern languages, visual and performing arts, and physical education.

What sets our curriculum apart is the amount of options available to you as you earn your BC Certificate of Graduation. We like to think of your experience – in academics, arts, athletics, clubs and councils, and service and leadership – as a huge buffet.

You have access to more than 120 courses and 65 clubs at the Senior School. You have the flexibility to choose to try a variety of options to find what you love most, or load up your plate with just the courses and subject areas you want to concentrate on.

Personalized Learning

SMUS is a pioneer in personalization. That means your education will be tailored to you – your strengths, your weaknesses and your interests. No two SMUS students will have the same experience at our school because they are given the room and support to personalize their experience. Everyone has a different way of learning and SMUS has both the breadth of courses and the depth of teaching so you can follow your own path.

Real-World Experiences

UNIVERSITY AND LIFE PREPARATION

Your Academic Advisor

Your Academic Advisor is a member of our dedicated University Counselling team, and is key to assisting you with plotting out your path through high school and into university. Their work with you begins as early as Grade 9 to help you choose your courses.

With the help of your Academic Advisor, and in consultation with your parents, you'll be guided through the process of discovering possible career and post-secondary options, researching universities and eventually applying to the post-secondary institutions of your choice. They'll help you find schools and programs that are a perfect fit for your learning style, your interests, and where you'll thrive as a student and young adult.

STEAM-Inspired Approach

In preparing students for life in a rapidly evolving world, we offer students innovative programs in STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics). In addition to the courses you can take in these subject areas, you will also have opportunities in extracurricular and extension activities in STEAM. We focus on problem-solving, inquiry-based, hands-on approaches that foster critical thinking, collaboration, resilience, and risk-taking. Embracing and exploring these skills will set you up for success inside the classroom and in your life after graduation.

Going to school on Vancouver Island will give you the chance to try camping, canoeing, hiking, kayaking, sailing, skiing, snowboarding, surfing and so much more!

Vancouver Island

SMUS is in the city of Victoria (see pages 24-25) on the southern tip of Vancouver Island on the west coast of Canada. You can travel to the Island by ferry or airplane. Victoria has a well-serviced airport with direct Canadian and international flights.

Weather

When you think of Canada, you probably think of cold temperatures and snow, but Victoria's climate is one of the mildest in Canada. It rarely ever snows in the city; however, the Island's diverse landscape means you could ski in the morning and surf in the afternoon. Compared to the rest of Canada, the winter is much warmer (the lowest average temperature in Victoria is 4°C/39°F) and we also get much less rain than Vancouver or Seattle.

Outdoor Leadership

Leadership skills are one of the core components of the outdoor education program, and our Outdoor Leadership course offers you a once-in-a-lifetime, hands-on learning experience. You will participate in a leadership and orientation training day, a wilderness first aid session and two multi-night outdoor trips before you take on the role of a student leader on an outdoor trip with younger students. HEALTHY MINDS, HEALTHY BODIES

As a university prep school, part of what you will learn at SMUS is how to balance your commitments to make sure you get the most from your educational experience. As you discover how to effectively learn, you will also gain the skills needed to ensure you are taking care of your physical and mental well-being.

Food and Dining

The Graves Hall dining hall in the Sun Centre is a community gathering place where you will come together to share meals and spend time between classes. The dining hall feeds both day and boarding students, providing breakfast, lunch and dinner. You'll have access to healthy and hot options at every meal, alongside a full salad bar, fruits, cereals and more. The kitchen staff will also work with you if you have allergies or dietary restrictions.

If you need a snack during the day, visit The Howard Café, our student-staffed coffee shop that serves lunch, hot and cold drinks and baked treats.

Health and Wellness

SMUS has a well-equipped, on-campus Health Centre, where nurses are on duty to provide medical assistance and a doctor comes to campus for appointments. If you need to see a specialist, the Health Centre will make an appointment and provide transportation. A hospital is only a five-minute drive from campus.

Your mental health is as important as your physical health, and staff at SMUS are committed to providing you with the support you need. You will regularly meet with your homeroom advisor who can guide you on academic or personal questions. You also have confidential, 24-hour support from our counselling team.

If you're involved in sports, you'll know that injuries happen, so SMUS also has a certified athletic therapist to help you safely get back to performing at your best.

Chapel

SMUS is a non-denominational school that welcomes all faiths and beliefs. The school has a Chapel where you'll join your classmates to reflect, listen and learn from other cultures, and build community. We base our gatherings on the school's Values, which are true to the school's aspirations and upheld within most cultures: respect, courage, honesty and service.

More than half of the Senior School gatherings are led entirely by students, giving you an opportunity to share in dialogue that is meaningful to you, your friends and your classmates.

Our day students will be eager to broaden their horizons by getting to know you and your culture.

Cross-Grade Connections

The school you'll join is much more than a high school. Our day school program begins with Junior Kindergarten, meaning you'll have opportunities to build connections with students of all ages. You'll have the chance to work alongside younger students at our Junior School and Middle School to be a role model and to practice leadership skills. Their curiosity, sense of wonder and eagerness to learn with you will create unforgettable learning experiences for both of you.

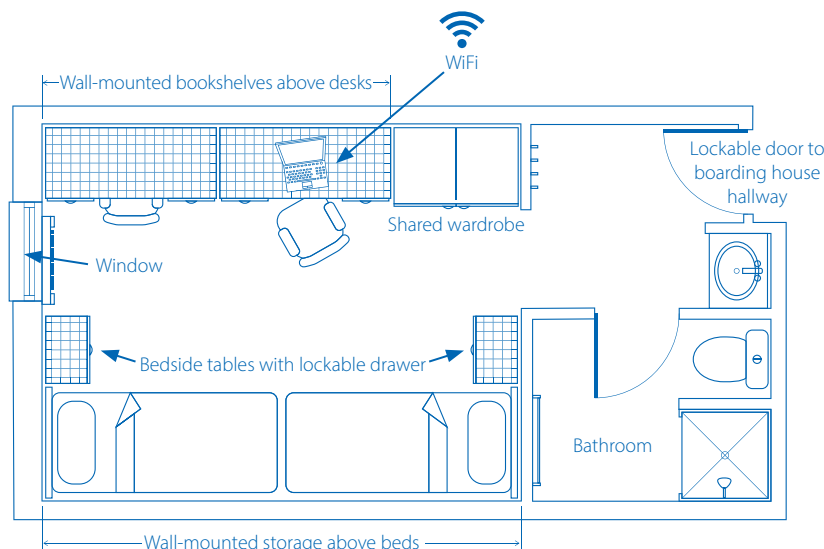
English and Modern Languages

LIVE WHERE YOU LEARN



There are many reasons that students come to Victoria and live on campus as a boarding student. For some it's for the increased academic opportunities, while for others it's for the adventure and independence. Whatever your motivation, you'll find a community here ready to welcome you.



Your Room and House

SMUS boarders live in bright, furnished rooms that are shared between two roommates. We are serious about your privacy, so your room also has its own bathroom – that means no communal showers and no large dormitory bathrooms at SMUS – which is uncommon for a boarding school.

We have six boarding houses, with 21 rooms in each and shared common rooms where you'll find TVs, games, kitchens and lots of great friends.

Your Boarding Family

You will share a private room with just one other student. Having a roommate gives you an instant friend to experience boarding with. Many roommates become great friends during their time at SMUS, and remain so even after graduation. We pride ourselves on getting to know each student to ensure you and your roommate are well-matched to live together.

You will live down the hall from adults called houseparents. Their number one priority is caring for you. They keep track of you and support your well-being, and provide guidance with your schooling. Most houseparents are also teachers here! Houseparents make sure your time as a boarding student is positive and memorable.

Evenings and Weekends

On school days, you'll have a set daily schedule. After school, you will usually be involved in an extracurricular activity before dinner and at 7 pm you'll have prep time – two hours when all the students in the boarding houses are quietly doing schoolwork. SMUS is located in the heart of a suburban neighbourhood in the safe city of Victoria. You'll develop independence when you want to go to the movies, go shopping or have dinner off campus. Our students love the fact that living in Victoria means they can take a public transit bus and be downtown in 15 minutes, or just walk to the nearby mall – and our boarding system balances well-being with independence to allow students to leave campus safely.

Join an Inclusive, Welcoming and Authentic Community

We pride ourselves on providing the best possible environment, which for us is a diverse environment. The real world is made up of people of different genders, cultures and orientations, and a key part of preparation for life is learning to work, study and socialize with people who have different backgrounds and lifestyles.

This is why boarding at SMUS has common areas where all students can spend time together, and why we place emphasis on sharing experiences with the other houses. It's also why we are emphatic about making everyone feel welcome in our community.

Independence and Time Management

Being a boarding student at SMUS means developing the skills that will be invaluable at university and beyond. BOARDING IS BETTER IN THE CITY

Located just outside the city's downtown core, SMUS's central location in the city of Victoria on Vancouver Island (you can read more about Vancouver Island on pages 14-15). You'll get to know Victoria very well. It's small, safe, easy to navigate and there are lots of fun things to do here.

Exploring the City

At SMUS, we think it's important you have the freedom to become more self-reliant. When you go to university, you will have to take buses and navigate a new place, so it's valuable prep to practice those skills in a small city like Victoria. Just like you would at home, when you leave campus you'll need to tell houseparents where you're going, who you'll be with and when you'll be back.

City of Gardens

One of the reasons you'll love living in Victoria is how beautiful the city is (we're known as the City of Gardens because of all the trees and green spaces). Victoria is almost completely surrounded by water so there are lots of beaches to explore. You'll also enjoy some great short hikes to get breathtaking views of the Olympic Mountains to the south and Mount Baker to the east.

SMUS and Hillside (Walk 10 mins)

Located in a quiet, tree-lined suburb, SMUS is a 10-minute walk to shopping, including Hillside Centre with clothes stores, a pharmacy, a bookstore and a grocery store. There are also restaurants, coffee shops, and a recreation centre nearby. Bus stops are located near campus.

Downtown Victoria (Bus 15 mins)

Downtown is on a direct bus route from SMUS and really has something for everyone. It's quite common for boarding students to head downtown on the weekend to shop, go to a board game cafe, eat out and watch a movie, or just relax in beautiful Beacon Hill Park. Downtown is also the cultural hub of Victoria, where you'll find museums, galleries and boutique shops.

School History

St. Michaels University School was founded in 1971 as an amalgamation of two boys schools: University School (founded in 1906) and St. Michael's School (1910). Building upon the traditions of a prestigious past, during the past half-century SMUS has grown to become one of Canada's very best independent schools. SMUS was the first school to offer Advanced Placement courses in Canada, in 1978, which was also the year that girls were admitted for the first time.

The Richmond Road Campus

When you arrive at our Senior School, you will arrive at the beautiful Richmond Road campus. The campus is a secure 17-acre site in the heart of Victoria, BC. School House (below), at the centre of our campus, was completed in 1910, and sits alongside modern facilities like the Monkman Athletic Complex, Schaffter Hall music building, and the Sun Centre, which houses our student commons and the majestic Graves Hall dining hall. You will also benefit from lots of green space on campus. We have four full-size grass fields and lots of spaces for students to relax outside and enjoy the British Columbia sunshine. If you join us for boarding school, you will also live on the Richmond Road campus in one of our purpose-built boarding houses.

Floreat

Top schools have great histories but to continue being successful you have to keep aiming higher. At SMUS, we are always looking to the future so our students benefit from the very latest ideas, teaching and facilities. This is why SMUS's strategic plan, Floreat (meaning 'let flourish'), is a key document which outlines the ambitious goals of the school. How to Apply to St. Michaels University School

In order to benefit most from a SMUS education, we recommend applying to Senior School for Grade 9.

However, demand for places at our school is high. Students are only able to start at SMUS at the beginning of the school year in September. We strongly recommend you apply at least 10 months in advance.

Step 1: Complete an online application

You apply to St. Michaels University School on our website using SMUS's Admissions Portal. Start at smus.ca/apply and follow the instructions.

You will be asked to provide documentation that includes report cards, teacher references, transcripts and a verification of citizenship. There is a non-refundable application fee you will pay at the time of applying.

Step 2: Interview and testing

Your application is reviewed by the Admissions team, who invite select candidates to visit the school for standardized testing and interviews. For international families who are unable to travel to SMUS, Admissions will make alternative arrangements for testing and interviewing.

Step 3: Admissions notifies you of the decision

If you receive an offer of admission, you will need to accept the offer by the deadline provided by the Admissions office. To accept the offer and hold your place, you will also pay a non-refundable registration fee.

English Language Learners (ELL) Program

After interviewing and testing, the Admissions team may offer admission to the English Language Learning program. The ELL program is for boarding students going into Grades 9 or 10 who need additional assistance with English. ELL students take additional English classes to support their studies at SMUS.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

SMUS offers both financial aid and scholarships. More information including conditions and deadlines to apply is available on the website.

Financial aid is confidential, needs-based and open to all students. SMUS awards upwards of \$1.8 million in financial aid to help students attend SMUS who might otherwise not be able to due to financial circumstances. If you feel the cost of a SMUS education is prohibitive, you should ask about financial aid.

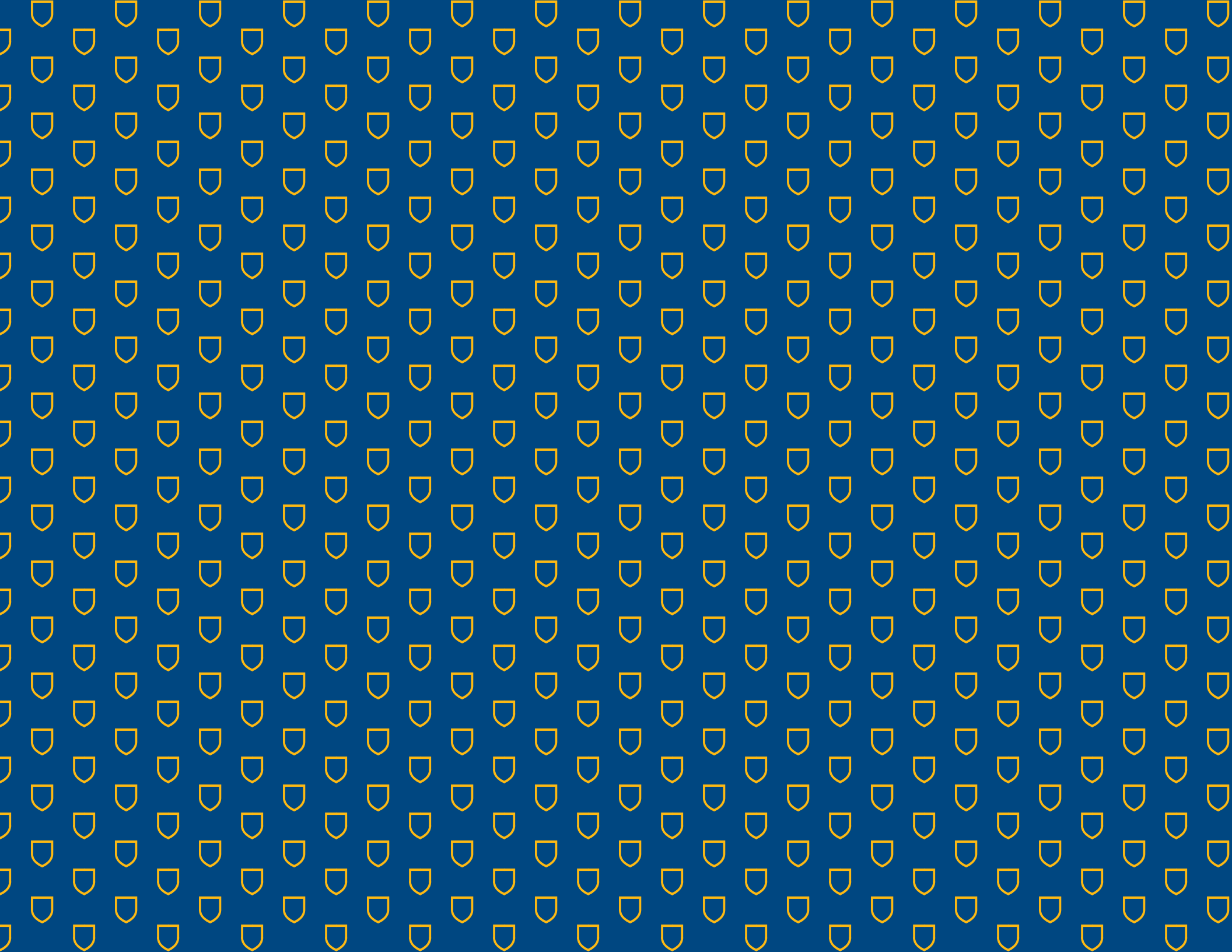
Scholarships are merit-based. SMUS offers a limited number of entrance scholarships for boarding students. To learn more, visit our website.
